- 1. Nominated by the home university;
- 2. Officially enrolled student of the home university;
- 3. With a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of at least 3.0 or better;
- 4. Proficient in English language; and
- 5. Student of good standing and character.

APPLICATION DOCUMENTS AND REQUIREMENTS

ALL DOCUMENTS MUST BE IN ENGLISH (or translated in English).

- 2. Official Transcript of Records/Academic Records
- 3. Proof of English proficiency (any of the following), with *minimum score of
 - a) TOEFL pbt 550 / TOEFL ibt 79 (MyBest scores accepted)
 - b) TOEIC 605
 - c) IELTS band of 6.0
 - d) CEFR C1
 - e) Certificate of English Proficiency or English as a Medium of Instruction
- 4. Copy of valid Passport Bio-page
- 5. Certificate or Letter of Good Moral Character (issued by a professor or faculty member)
- 6. Copy of Enrollment Form (or list of subjects enrolled for the current semester at home university)

[* For inbound students with scores lower than the required English Proficiency Score, they will be required to take at least 2 modules of English in the DLSU Center of English for Speakers of Other Languages or CIESOL.]

5-STEP INBOUND APPLICATION PROCESS

- Step 1: Nomination by home university (Nominate your student using this link: https://forms.gle/c8ahr6vAifZPFzKa7)
- Step 2: Submission of application requirements (Home University Exchange Coordinator will email scanned copies of all application documents to: **exchange@dlsu.edu.ph**)
- Step 3: Issuance of Acceptance Letter (DLSU will email this to the Home University Exchange Coordinator)
- Step 4: Selection of courses using the Inbound Cross-Enrollment Form (DLSU Coordinator will send the list of online courses (LOOP) to partner university Exchange Coordinator.
- Step 5: Inbound student enrollment in courses at DLSU (will be done by the DLSU Exchange Coordinator)

ADMISSION AND ENROLLMENT POLICIES

- 1. Only complete application documents will be processed by DLSU under the Inbound Exchange Program.
- 2. Enlistment and enrollment in courses must be done in coordination with DLSU Exchange Coordinator.
- 3. Inbound student can enroll in a maximum of <u>3 courses (or 9 units) for undergraduate level</u> and <u>2 courses (or 6 units) for graduate level per trimester.</u>
- 4. Inbound student can only enroll in non-prerequisite courses, electives, and major courses with no prerequisites. For major courses or subjects, approval of the DLSU College Associate Dean or Department Chairperson is required.
- 5. Dropping, withdrawal, or change of courses is only allowed during the Week 1 of the term without surcharge.
- Inbound students must comply with the rules and regulations of DLSU Student Handbook.
- 7. Inbound students are required to undergo and complete the Lasallian InSPIRE (International Student Program for Involvement in Responsive Exchange) as well as participation in all official activities and events of the International Center for international students.

COURSE CREDITS AND GRADING SYSTEM

As stated in the DLSU Student Handbook, the credit for a course is determined by the number and length of class meetings in every week of a trimester. Thus, a class meeting of 3 hours a week for one trimester gives 3 hours of credit. Some classes on the undergraduate level designated as laboratory require 2 or 3 hours to equal one trimester hour of credit. The number of units is indicated on the course offerings, the Student Enrollment Record, the Enrollment Assessment Form, and other documents/materials related to the course.

DLSU Grading System: The University adopts the numerical grading system. The grade INC ("Incomplete") does not exist in the grading system.
