ACADEMIC INFORMATION

CREDITS

J-1 Students are required to take between 12 and 15 credits per semester. Generally, a 3 credit course meets in-person for 3 hours per week. This equates to 45 contact hours per class, but this can vary. Courses are taught in English. There are 15 weeks in each semester.

COURSE RESTRICTIONS

See course catalog for restrictions. Students must have pre-requisites or prior approval from the Department Chair at GVSU. The course description in the GVSU catalog will list any pre-requisites or restrictions.

Limited support available.

COURSE REGISTRATION

Once students have been accepted, they will be contacted via email by their academic advisor. The advisors will assist students to register for the proper courses. Students should be registered full-time prior to their arrival on-campus. Students will have the week of orientation and the first week of classes to make any necessary changes to their schedule.

EMPLOYMENT

Last Updated: October 2021

Student are eligible to work on-campus for up to 20 hours per week. An overview of regulations will be covered during the orientation.

VISA PROCEDURES AND ASSISTANCE

Students must submit a completed Exchange Student Application. Once the application is submitted a DS -2019 will be sent to the student. Students will be required to pay the SEVIS fee before applying for their visa. Details may be found at www.fmjfee.com. Exchange students will be required to apply for their visa at the nearest US Embassy.

Kate Stoetzner is the contact for visa related matters.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Health insurance is mandatory by US Federal Regulations. All exchange students at GVSU are required to provide proof of insurance (in English) at the time of orientation that covers the entire duration of the program.

Federal Law requires the following coverage:

- \$100,000 minimum coverage
- \$50,000 minimum medical evacuation coverage
- \$25,000 minimum coverage for repatriation
- \$500 maximum deductible per accident or illness
- Other Conditions:

Cover pre-existing conditions after a reasonable waiting period Includes provision for co-payment that does not exceed 25% co-pay by the exchange visitor Does not exclude benefits for perils inherent to the activities of the Exchange Visitor's Program Must be underwritten by an insurance company that meets the rating requirements of the USIA or is backed by the full faith and credit of the Exchange Visitor's government Any accompanying spouse and dependent(s), also may be subject to the requirements of the Affordable Care Act [22 CFR 62.14 (a)]



GVSU EXCHANGE STUDENT APPLICATION GUIDE

Thank you for your interest in applying to Grand Valley State University's partner exchange program. In order to apply, you will need to submit the following information with the application:

- 3. A typed statement of your proposed program of study at GVSU and how it will relate to your present academic program at your home university.
- 4. Evidence of Financial Support (see section IV for details)
- 5. Copy of your passport

The Application

The application is required in order to apply to GVSU and to obtain the "Certificate of Eligibility" DS-2019. The DS-2019 is required in order to obtain a J-1 exchange visitor visa.

Please answer all of the questions completely and return the form as well as items 1-5 listed above to your home institution's international office. They will forward your application along with their nomination to GVSU.
