Please note:

Semester dates: Remember that at UON Semester 1 runs Feb-June and Semester 2 runs July-Nov.

Course Levels: 1000 level courses are typically taken in 1st year, 2000 level in 2nd year and so on. 5000 and 6000 level courses are postgraduate courses.

Campus information: Most courses are offered at our Newcastle Campuses: Callaghan and Newcastle City Precinct, however some courses are offered on the Ourimbah campus which is 1.5 hours drive south of Newcastle. Please check your course information in the handbook carefully.

Compressed Delivery: Some course are taught via compressed delivery, where the entire course will be taught daily, full time over a shorter period- usually around 2 weeks. Compressed delivery courses are often run prior to the official semester dates. Please check you course information in the handbook carefully.

Enabling Courses: Several courses in the handbook will have 'EP' in front of the course code, e.g. EPHUMA1000. These courses are not available to Exchange or Study Abroad students. Similar alternative courses will exist under the different course codes which are available.

Entry Requirements	Undergraduate admissions: Students are required to have a minimum GPA of 2.0/4.0 or equivalent. Students should have completed at least one year of full time study at a university or other institution of higher education.
	Postgraduate Admissions: Students are required to have a completed bachelor degree in a relevant discipline.
	Gap year Admissions: Students are required to submit a completed high school transcript to be assessed on a case by case basis.

Accepting Your Offer

1. Review your offer letter

Successful applicants will receive an offer of a place which will include their name, provide information on fees, including tuition and OSHC, the date of commencement and duration of the program of study and the refund policy.

If you have supplied a list of courses you wish to participate in, their approval or non-approval will be addressed in your offer. Be sure you read and understand all aspects of your offer letter. After reviewing your offer, if you believe any aspect (incl. personal details) requires amendment, please contact IA@newcastle.edu.au prior to any further action.

2. Arrange Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

It is a condition of your student visa to have OSHC for the duration of your student visa. Please note that travel insurance and your university insurance *is not the same as OSHC.* OSHC needs to be issued by an approved Australian provider as per Australian Government Regulations.

If you opt for UON to arrange your OSHC for you, you will need to pay the OSHC amount listed on your offer letter. If you are purchasing your own Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) please deduct this amount from your total deposit payable and send a copy of your policy along with your acceptance.

3. Pay any deposit payable

Your offer letter will state any deposit payable. This amount will need to be paid in order for you to receive your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE). If you are arranging your own OSHC, please deduct this amount from your total deposit payable, and send a copy of your policy certificate along with your acceptance.

Applying for your VISA	4. Accept your offer After reviewing your offer letter, please complete and sign Section 6 Offer Acceptance in your offer letter and upload a copy of your signed acceptance to the Access Portal. If you are having difficulties meeting the conditions of your offer, please contact ia@newcastle.edu.au to discuss your options. Once UON has received the above documents and your deposit has been received, you will be issued with a CoE. In order to apply for a Student Visa you will need a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) as well as proof of your OSHC. Students should not apply for a Visa until they have these 2 documents. UON staff are legally unable to advise on Visas, for any information regarding types of Visas, applications and processing time, please direct your query to the Department of Home Affairs directly: https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/
