Pre-candidacy Oral Examination Tips and Guidelines

In order to make your Pre-candidacy Oral Examination a more fruitful event for both you and the audience, we suggest the following key points that presenters should keep in mind:

Rules of the Presentation:

- 1. Present a work-in-progress thesis.
- 2. The presentation will be evaluated according to five criteria: 1) structure, 2) research question, 3) analytical framework, 4) methodology, and 5) evidence of data collection and data analysis. Presentations should be approximately 15-20 minutes per student followed by an equal period for a Q&A session.

Helpful Tips for Presentations

- Try to visualize your work by using diagrams and figures.
- Provide a 1-page handout to the audience with the main points of your presentation. (Do not print your slides as your handout.)
- Ensure your presentation is within the time allocated.
- Avoid reading your notes. You should know the material and the important points.
- Speak clearly and slowly.
- Avoid using jargon (or define the terminology if you use it), so that people in other fields can still understand your work.
